Creative Elements ☐ Build a "Campfire" near the altar area. ☐ Give people "wood cookie" name tags to make as they enter the sanctuary ☐ Add a "woodsy" feel to your Sanctuary by using dark brown and green fabrics and branches from outside.
Call To Worship: One: As we gather for worship we celebrate All: A space to learn and grow. (play a CD with wordless nature sounds) One: As we gather for worship we celebrate All: A space to be welcome and worship. Opening Prayer: Awesome God, we come this morning to celebrate and to worship all that you have done in our lives. We come, remembering the experiences and memories we have had in our lives that help us to reconnect to you. We remember hearing birds chirping in the morning; that feeling that you are right there with us! May our worship renew us, inspire us, and draw us outside of ourselves to find a special place to connect to your holy presence. For this we pray, Amen.

Build a Campfire Build a campfire and talk about camp. Pass out camp brochures, offer incentive programs (if kids received a Bible or were confirmed or graduated from Elementary or Middle School).
Take a Hike Set up 3 stations around the sanctuary representing each of the camp sites in our Annual Conference [Eagle River Camp (Juneau), Hope Retreat Center (Hope), Birchwood Camp(Chugiak)]. Take the children for a "hike" to visit each station. Have the kids take the leader on a trust walk around the sanctuary, wearing a blindfold. Talk about the differences it makes when we have someone helping us to do difficult or challenging things. Try to draw out elements of relationship lived out in a faith community: Jesus offers a new way of living; it takes a whole community working together to help us live in Jesus' way.
